Scholarship Value: \$500

A scholarship will be awarded each year to a female NBCC student pursuing a non-traditional skilled trade.

Application Deadline: July 30th, 2019

*****Authorization:** Scholarship recipients authorize New Boots: Progressing Women in Trades to publish their names and/or photos, with the sole intent of promoting this scholarship.

What is New Boots: Progressing Women in Trades?

A provincial network & resource hub that aims to promote, support and mentor women in non-traditional skilled trades.

What is the purpose of this scholarship?

To support a female pursuing a non-traditional skilled trade postsecondary program at a NBCC campus.

What is a non-traditional trade for women?

A trade where women account for less than 25% of the current workforce.

Selection Process:

- Applications must contain all required documents to be considered (application form, proof of postsecondary acceptance and brief essay)
- Each applicant will be evaluated on the quality of their essay.

Eligibility:

- You are a resident of NB
- You have been accepted or waitlisted for an eligible program (*Please refer to eligible programs list).
- You have answered the following questions:
 1. What inspired you to pursue a non-traditional skilled trade?
 2. How will this scholarship help ensure your success in your program?
 3. How do you envision your career path?
