

FOREIGN AID

FORMS OF FOREIGN AID:

“Bilateral Aid” - is one of the most common forms of foreign aid. In this case, aid is sent directly from the donor country to the recipient country.

“Tied Aid” - a form of bilateral aid given with certain conditions attached. For example, the materials given must be purchased in the donor country. (ie. If Kenya is being equipped through the Canadian foreign aid program, then the materials for that school would be largely supplied from Canada).

“Multilateral Aid” - involves the transfer of aid from a number of donor countries through an international agency such as the “Red Cross”.
