

Grad Write-Up

Students are to compose a brief paragraph about their high school experience to accompany their grad photo in the MVHS yearbook. These paragraphs can include specific memories, what you like, etc. Graduates can also thank family members and friends. The paragraph should be written from the first person point of view. You may also choose a quote or song lyrics perhaps to add to your write-up.

You may consider including some of the following in your paragraph:

Congratulations to the class of 2018.

I would like to thank my family/friends for...

I'll never forget the time...

My greatest achievement in high school was...

My future plans are...

I survived high school with the help of...

Students are free to write about whatever they want, but keep in mind that each write-up will be edited for language and legal considerations.

*Write-ups should be **NO MORE THAN 100 WORDS**. If your write up is more than 100 words, you will be called back to edit as we cannot fit it in the space provided for each grad.

*If you find that you are running out of space in your paragraph, you can save room by using initials rather than full names (ex: John Smith = JS).

*It is preferable that the grad write-ups be emailed to Ms. Grattan at krystal.grattan@nbed.nb.ca, however, they may also be dropped off **at the office** to the attention of Ms. Grattan. If your write-up is handwritten, please be sure that it is neatly done, as we do not want to misinterpret your information.

*Grad write-ups are due by **Friday, March 1st**. **If you do not complete a grad write-up, your picture will appear at the end of the graduate pages.**
