# INDEPENDENT NOVEL STUDY

These are your instructions for the week of April 14th-April 17th

### 1. Continue your Reading Log:

You must complete this reading log each day you read your novel. A copy of the reading log template is on the next page. Try to read for at least 30 minutes each day! The brief comment section of the log can be done in point form and should be your reflection on what you read.

### 2. Continue your Vocabulary:

As you begin to read your novel, start to make a list of 20 words that you come across that are unfamiliar to you. Be sure to record the page number for each word. Later on, there will be an assignment associated with these words that you have found.

#### 3. Reading Response #2:

Answer the following questions about the middle chapters of your book:

- a. What is the general feeling or mood of the book? (ex. sad, happy, hopeful) Give specific examples of how the author creates that feeling or mood.
- b. Who is the narrator of the story? Is he/she inside or outside the story? What is his or her relationship to the story?
- c. Choose a sentence or phrase that attracts you. Explain why you chose it, its value in the book, and its value to you
