

Healthy and Safe Schools – School Winter Plan Grades 9-12



Revised: January 28, 2022

The following is the School Winter Plan 2022 for Grades 9-12 students and school personnel in New Brunswick public schools. Throughout the winter months, the province may be experiencing high number of COVID-19 cases and an increase in transmission, schools may be directed by Public Health to move in and out of the alert levels.

If students or school personnel have one new or worsening symptom that develops, they will not be permitted to attend school until they have a negative point-of-care-rapid-test (POCT).

If a student or a school personnel has a constant and recurring symptom, for instance seasonal allergies, they may continue to attend school after they have received a negative POCT. The test can be done once for the same recurring symptom, as long as that symptom is not worsening and no new symptoms develop, at which point a retest will be necessary.

Students are encouraged to bring at least two well-fitted, three-layer masks to school each and ever day as per Public Health guidance.
